Topic: Me, Myself and I - Biography and Autobiography

Syllabus outcomes:

Task Information:

Text Type: Speech (Biography/Autobiography)

Each student will be required to prepare and present a three minute speech about themselves and their role models.

The speech should include:

- 1. Autobiographical information about you including details of your date/place of birth, the origin/meaning of your name, cultural background, and where you grew up/live now. Your current interests and goals for school and/or career should be outlined in this section.
- 2. Biographical information on one personal role model. This person could be a family member, teacher, friend or sports coach and must be someone that you know personally and admire. You may need to interview your chosen personal role model to learn more about them. In this section of the speech, you should provide details about:
 - The name, date and place of birth, and family background of the person.
 - Their personality and appearance.
 - Their achievements.
 - Why you admire this person.
- 3. Biographical information on one public role model. This person may be an author, sportsperson, politician or celebrity. This section cannot contain information on the scientist researched in your Science class. In this section, you should provide details about:
 - The name, date and place of birth, and family background of the person.
 - Their personality and appearance.
 - Their achievements.
 - Why you admire this person.

Additional Task Information:

Each student will need to use palm cards to assist in the presentation of the task. You should ensure that your palm cards are neatly written and numbered in the correct order. However, students should avoid becoming over reliant on their palm cards.

Students need to speak in a clear, enthusiastic and well-projected voice. They also need to present using a confident stance and correct posture.

Marks will be deducted for not meeting time limits. For every 30 seconds under or over the time limit, 2 marks will be deducted from the total mark.

The speech should be both interesting and informative. Students need to display enthusiasm during the speech.

Students will be selected at random to present their speech.

Submission of task:

On the day of your assessment task, you must submit:

- 1. Palm cards.
- 2. A transcript of the speech. A transcript is a separate written copy of your speech.
- 3. Your marking criteria sheet.

Important:

This task is part of your formal assessment in this subject. Tasks not completed on the due date will have 20% of marks deducted for each day late. If you are sick on the due date, you will have to provide a medical certificate or note from parent/guardian to support your appeal. The medical certificate or parental note will need to be presented to Mr Zouroudis or your teacher on the morning of the first day you are back at school.
