- form Demonstrate your ability to create a magazine article containing the essential features

# **Task Information:**

You have been asked by a travel magazine to write an article about ONE of the landforms below. Your article needs to educate people about the landform, how it was made and how humans use or have changed it.

- Cave of the Crystals, Mexico
- Chocolate Hills, Philippines
- Twelve Apostles, Australia

# **Article Content:**

- You will need to include the following information in your magazine article:
  - 1. Location: Provide a detailed description of where your landform is found. Include a labelled <u>small- and large-scale</u> map
  - 2. Appearance: Provide a detailed description of what it looks like.
  - 3. Landscape: Describe what type of landscape your landform is found in

- 4. **Geomorphic process/es**: Provide a detailed explanation of how this landform was created or shaped by natural (geomorphic) processes
- 5. **Human impacts:** Provide a detailed description of how the landform is used by humans, including tourists, and how they have impacted or changed it.
- 6. Interesting facts: Include the geological age of your landform, as well as no less than 4 interesting facts. This will be in the side-bar of the article.

#### **IMPORTANT:**

This task is part of your formal assessment for this subject. Tasks not submitted on the due date will be given zero. This task is worth 40% and will contribute to your yearly report.

## **Article Format:**

### Your magazine article MUST include the following:

- > Number of pages:1-2 A4 pages (Landscape or Portrait)
- > Text size: Information written in 12-14 font. The heading can be larger
- > Heading : A title that states the name and catches the readers attention
- > Lead: A short paragraph below the heading summarising the article in a few sentences
- > By-line: Your name
- Subheadings: Headings to divide your information
- > Callout: At least two enlarged phrases or quotes from the article
- > Graphics: Photos and/or diagrams with captions (labels)
- Side bar: A box with your Interesting Facts on one side of your article
- \*\* Make sure you watch the 'How to format your magazine article' to help you\*\*

## Submission information:

- ➤ Use Microsoft Word, Google Docs or Canva to create your article. (Note: If you use Canva, download the file as a PDF then hand in the file. Do not hand in a link.)
- Submit your article in Google Classroom. Go to Classwork > Assessment Tasks Geography > Task 3: Landform magazine drop-box and resources.
- ➤ Hand in your article by the due date.
