HIGH POTENTIAL AND GIFTED EDUCATION

We offer High Potential and Gifted Education (HPGE) programs to extend and challenge our students to reach their full potential. In Years 7 and 8 we have streamed HPGE classes, and in Years 9 and 10 there are several HPGE classes across the curriculum.



STUDENT WELLBEING

Student wellbeing is at the heart of our learning philosophy at GRC Peakhurst Campus. When our students are supported, they can achieve their best. Our multi-disciplinary Wellbeing team includes psychologists, youth workers, careers advisers, Year Advisers and Executive staff, to provide a network of support to each and every student.



CREATIVE AND PERFORMING ARTS

Our Creative and Performing Arts faculty excel in nurturing the artistic side of our students. Our annual PeakView competition for visual arts has student artworks on public display, with students vying to take out the community's popular vote. Our annual Peakform concert has our performers showcasing their talents in music, dance and drama, wowing audiences every year. ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS

We offer many extra-curricular programs, including debating and other academic competitions, plus overseas study tours for Japanese. Our Student Representative Council provides many opportunities for personal growth for students.



SPORT

Our students excel in the sporting arena, representing our school in swimming, athletics, cross country, football, soccer, plus a multitude of other sports. Many of our students go on to regional, zone and state competitions as well as representative pathways. GRC Peakhurst participates in multiple gala days throughout the year, including the St George Oz Tag and NSW Futsal competitions, among others. LEARNING ENHANCEMENT

Our Learning Enhancement Team caters for mainstream students who experience hearing and vision impairments, as well as many other health and learning challenges. We provide individual support and small group tuition, as well as Individualised Education Plans.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Our Special Education Unit caters for students with mild to moderate intellectual and/or physical disabilities, as well as dedicated Autism classes. Our students follow the Pathways program.



FIRST NATIONS STUDENTS

Our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students participate in various cultural activities including dance, education, cultural connection, mentoring, art, excursions and much more. Our Aboriginal Student Coordinator ensures that our First Nations students have opportunities to strengthen their connection to culture, and provides cultural guidance and advocacy.
