- Examines and evaluates strategies to manage current and future challenges PD4-1
- Examines and demonstrates the role help-seeking strategies and behaviours play in supporting themselves and others PD4-2

TASK DESCRIPTION

PART A - PSA Creation

Throughout this topic you have been learning about risky behaviours, situations and how to make informed choices to create positive or alternative ways to minimise the harm to yourself and others.

For your Public Service Announcement (PSA), you will take on the role of Health and Safety Education Officers. Your job is to **individually** create a Public Service Announcement (PSA) that is engaging to adolescents aged (12-17).

'A Public Service Announcement (PSA) is an informative and creative message that is meant to raise the audience's awareness about an issue, show the importance of a problem or issue, convey information, or promote a behavioural change'.

Firstly, begin by picking one (1) of the following topics for your Public Service Announcement (PSA):

- Road Safety
- Drug Awareness
- Sun Safety
- Water Safety (Pool/Beach)

Within your Public Service Announcement (PSA), you must address information about the following questions:

- 1. **Explain** your topic (including definitions, some background information about the topic).
- 2. **Statistics** (3) to support why it is important that adolescents are informed about this topic? i.e. Why is it relevant to them? Should be current and Australian statistics.
- 3. **Describe** how your chosen topic can impact adolescents? Include (3) negative outcomes that can result from risky decisions within your chosen topic.
- 4. **Describe** (3) strategies that adolescents implement to help keep themselves and others safe in relation to your chosen area?
- 5. **Explain** (3) places where adolescents can go to receive further information about your chosen topic, including how easy they are to access.

Your Public Service Announcement (PSA) should be presented in one (1) the following ways:

- Video
- Infographic
- Website
- Song/Rap
- Poster
- Brochure/Pamphlet
- Any other relevant way of getting information across (check with your teacher)

PSA – Samples: Below are a few examples of ways in which you may like to <u>set out your PSA</u>.

Note, the information you include in your PSA will need to include the 5 key questions above.

PART B - Presentation

Your Public Service Announcement (PSA) will then be shown to the class. Ensure that it is **submitted via Google Classroom_prior** to the due date so it can be shown on the day of presentations. Following on from this, you will be required to perform a speech that lasts between 1-2 minutes that aims to inform your class about the Public Service Announcement (PSA) you created. Palm cards may be used if required.

During your speech you should aim to speak about the following areas:

- -What topic did you choose for your PSA?
- -What type of PSA did you create, including the process undertaken in creating it?
- -Why is your chosen topic important to adolescents?
- -How can adolescents be safe within the context of your topic?
- -How does this topic impact the broader community and society in general?
- -Interesting facts/findings/statistics about your topic.

PART C - Peer Assessment

During class presentations, you will be required to pick another presenter that has chosen a different topic to yours and answer the questions in relation to their presentation.

This sheet will then be handed in to your teacher as part of your assessment on the day of presentations.

FORMAL ASSESSMENT UNDERSTANDING:

This task is a formal assessment. This assessment task must be submitted on time. Computer difficulties, other technological issues or a student's lack of organisation are not valid excuses for late submission of this task. Any difficulty with the task must be brought to the attention of the classroom teacher at least several days before the due date of the task.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU ARE SICK/ABSENT ON THE DUE DATE:
