Deputies' Report

At Georges River College Peakhurst Campus, we consistently incorporate our school values of respect, responsibility and excellence into all areas of our school. As Term 2 unfolds, a focus on students achieving excellence by working to the best of their ability is particularly relevant with many students currently completing a number of assessment tasks and with the upcoming NAPLAN and half yearly exams.

The NAPLAN tests are conducted Australia wide over three days next week – Tuesday 10th May, Wednesday 11th May and Thursday 12th May. A catch up day for students who have been absent for a NAPLAN test is scheduled for Friday 13th May.

The NAPLAN tests are designed to assess the skills of all Australian students in literacy and numeracy. The tests provide relevant data to parent and caregivers on the achievements of students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9.

The following areas of **literacy** are assessed:

- Language conventions – spelling, grammar and punctuation
- Writing
- Reading

In **numeracy**, the content areas assessed are:

- Number
- Measurement, chance and data
- Space
- Algebra, function and pattern.

At a year group assembly on Wednesday 4th May, all students in Year 7 and 9 were provided with a specific timetable outlining where and when their NAPLAN Exams will be conducted here at GRC Peakhurst on Tuesday 10th May, Wednesday 11th May and Thursday 12th May. This year, Yr 7 Naplan exams will be conducted during roll call, period 1 and period 2 whilst Year 9 Naplan exams will be conducted during periods 3 and 4 on the dates specified above.

The Year 10 half yearly exam period will commence on Friday 13th May, running through until Thursday 19th May. Year 10 students have received a detailed half yearly timetable which can also be found on the schools web site. Year 10 students are reminded to return their permission slips allowing them to return home to study following their last exam on each day during the exam period.

The Year 9 half yearly exam period will commence on Tuesday 7th June running through until Thursday 9th June. Year 9 students will be provided with a detailed half yearly exam timetable shortly.

Now that the days are starting to become a little cooler, it is important that all our students continue to wear full school uniform. Full school uniform includes a GRC Peakhurst school jumper or jacket, especially for those cooler mornings / days. GRC Peakhurst Campus Uniform can be purchased new at Lowes Hurstville or Roselands. The school also has a second hand uniform shop that is run and supported by the P&C. The second hand shop is open on Wednesday mornings from 8am-9am.

The HSC and Careers Expo 2016

On the day students will receive information from Universities, Tertiary Institutions and Training Colleges. Furthermore, students can engage in conversation with industry professionals to gain key insights into career areas.

Work Health and Safety White Card Training

The first training session for the White Card has been completed. A group of 10 students were successful in completing the White Card on the last day of Term 1. The White

Card is a Safety Training Permit requirement for all construction and building work (or to enter any construction site). The students that have the White Card can now engage in work experience in building and construction or related trades that take place on a construction site. For example, Plumbing, Carpentry and Electrical work. The Permit is held for life so it will be useful for students that are planning for a Career in Building and Construction and related trades. If your child is interested in gaining this credential please have them register with me for the next training day.

Coffee School, Professional Barista Training

Year 9 and Year 10 students were successful in gaining Statement of Attainment In the area of Barista, coffee preparation. This was a very fun training day held in the CBD. The students worked very hard for this credential during the 8 hour course. 

With the half yearly exams just around the corner, parents are also encouraged to closely monitor the completion of homework and assigned tasks in preparation for assessments (as outlined in assessment booklets distributed earlier this year). Please note that all assessment task notifications will be uploaded to the school website and a push notification alert will be sent via the school app. This app (Skoolbag) can be downloaded from the Apple App Store, Google Play Store and Windows Store by searching for 'Peakhurst Campus'.

Students who continue to find the content too difficult are encouraged to attend the Homework Centre on Monday and/or Tuesday afternoons in the school library and are advised to speak with their classroom teacher as soon as possible, so that additional support can be provided.

Your child is encouraged to attempt these papers under examination conditions and to see their class teacher regarding any questions they are having difficulty with.

ICAS Competitions

The following competitions will be offered to students this year.

The ICAS Digital Technologies (formerly Computer Skills) Competition will be held on Tuesday 17th May 2016 while the ICAS Mathematics Competition will be held on Tuesday 16th August 2016. The competition is open to all students.

While closing dates have now closed for the Digital Technologies competition, any student interested in participating in the Mathematics competition can pick up an information note and permission slip from their Mathematics or Computing teacher. It is advised that all red classes participate in this competition. The cost of entry is \$8.00. Payment will need to be made to the front office and permission slips are to be returned to the Mathematics Staffroom.

Mathletics

Mathletics is an interactive online computer resource which includes activities, support lessons and tests for the Australian curriculum (K – 12). It also provides an excellent animated mathematics dictionary as well as basic numeracy challenges against students from all over the world.

Over the past few years, the Mathematics Faculty has been utilising Mathletics and incorporating its use into teaching, homework and assessment programs. The cost of this valuable resource is \$10 per student per year. If you have not already done so this year, please arrange for your child to pay \$10 at the front office as soon as possible.

Regular use of this online tool will help students:

- Consolidate content taught during lessons.
- Revise in preparation for examinations at home.
- Receive assistance at any time, using the support button, when struggling with specific concepts.

Students who do not have access to the Internet at home may use the school library during recess and lunch or arrange a time with their class teacher to use the A7 computer lab.

Digi Ed (for Year 9 IST Students)

Later this term, on Friday 27th May, 2016 (Week 5A) as a part of the Option Topic 'Digital Media', all students from Year 9

IST (Information and Software Technology) will be taking part in a Digi Ed incursion. Students will be using the stopmotion / claymation process, to storyboard, animate, edit and burn their short clip onto a DVD.

Students are excited about this incursion and have been provided with a letter outlining the necessary details. Please ensure payment is made to the Front Office and permission slips are returned to me by no later than Monday 23rd May 2016. Photos and animations will be published in a later edition of Peak.
