HSIE

After an unprecedented start to Semester 2, we would like to thank students and parents for their continued resilience and commitment to learning during the home learning period and our return to regular schooling.

I would personally like to thank members of the HSIE department, Ms Beck, Mr Church, Ms Cvijetic, Ms Hamilton, Mr Sarandos, Ms Schenk, Ms Vlachos and Mr Vrhovac, for their ongoing dedication to teaching this semester.

Returning to school has meant that many of the practical activities that we couldn't run online have been implemented

over recent weeks. This has allowed for plenty of engaging HSIE lessons.

Year 7 learns about contour lines through Lego.

One of the geographical mapping skills that we teach in Year 7 is how to read contour lines on a topographic map. After working through an explanation activity, students were tasked with applying their new skills by using lego bricks to convert the shape and height of a hill or mountain on a map into a 3D model. Each different coloured brick represented a change in altitude.



Year 7 also honed their skills in using mapping coordinates by engaging in a friendly game of Battleship!



Year 9 Uses playdoh to understand land relief and aspect.



Tiana M, Ronald F and Natasha P will get the opportunity to complete the Certificate I in Hospitality at the end of January 2022, during the holiday break.

Specific details follow:

- Date: Monday 24 January 2022 Friday 28 January 2022 (campus closed Wednesday 26 January due to public holiday) all 4 days must be attended in order to complete required work.
- Time: 9.00am 3.30pm
- Meeting place: Kitchen 1
- Bring all food and drink, as the canteen will be closed.
- Wear suitable clothing, closed in shoes.
- Bring any Personal Protective Equipment previously required/ allocated to you by TAFE NSW and notebook and pen.

The student will need to:

- Wear a mask, including in class. There are lawful reasons for not wearing a mask. If you have a lawful reason, you should carry documentation, such as a medical certificate, letter from a health practitioner or disability support agency, or a statutory declaration
- Check-in using the Service NSW QR codes displayed
- Socially distance and practise good hand hygiene

White Card Training to be held Term 4, Week 11 on 14th December and 15th December

A white card (or general construction induction card) is a mandatory requirement for workers who want to carry out construction work.

The white card provides people entering the construction industry with a basic knowledge of requirements under Workplace Health Safety laws, the common hazards and risks likely to be encountered on construction sites and how these risks should be controlled.

The white card becomes void if you haven't attended a construction site for two consecutive years or more.
