Greetings

You say good bye to someone. Sayounara.

You say good afternoon/hello to someone. Konnichiwa

Arigatou gozaimasu/domo /arigatou You say thank you or thanks to someone.

You say good evening to someone. Konbanwa

You say good night to someone. Oyasumi/ Oyasumi nasai

Self - introduction

• You meet someone for the first time. Hajimemashite.

Watashi/Boku wa Name desu。

Douzo Yoroshiku (Bow to show respect).

Countries & Nationality

• I come from Australia. Watashi wa oosutoraria kara kimashita.

I come from Japan. Watashi wa nihon kara kimashita.
 I am Australian nationality. Watashi wa oosutoraria jin desu.

I am Japanese nationality.
 Watashi wa nihon jin desu.

*Extension

• I am <u>Australia born</u> **Japanese**. *Watashi wa <u>oosutoraria de umareta</u> **nihon jin** desu.

Numbers

• You translate the given Japanese numbers into English.

Hachi ni ichi yon – go roku san nana = 8214 - 5637

七九九四 - 八六一五 = 7994 8615
