OUTCOMES TO BE ASSESSED:

TASK – TOPIC TEST

The topic test will assess the ‘**Puberty**’ content taught in your theory unit ‘My Great Big Adventure’. At the start of your lesson you will be required to enter the room quietly under examination conditions.

You will have the remainder of the period to complete the test.

If you finish your test early, make sure you use the time to go over your responses and answers and proofread your work.

- Short & Extended response.
- Labelling.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU ARE ABSENT:

If you are absent on the date of your test you must see your teacher or Mr Morley (HT PDHPE) on the first day that you are back at school with a medical certificate. Your teacher will then discuss with you when you will sit your test. It will most likely be the first day that you come back to school.

LATE SUBMISSION OF ASSESSMENT TASKS
