<u>Assessment criteria:</u> In your answer/s you will be assessed on how well you: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Respond to and analyse a film and/or novel text of your choice. • Articulate your understanding of genre using appropriate language choices. • Analyse character, themes and narrative events through the use of genre conventions and film/language techniques. • Ability to speak in a clear, well-projected voice using a confident stance and correct posture. 	

IMPORTANT NOTE: You have a choice between two assessment tasks to complete. Carefully read the instructions below and choose **one** task to complete. Please note the difference in grade distributions in the two tasks.

Task Information

Task One – Possible Grade A-E

For Task One, you will present a speech in class focused on the representation of genre conventions in a **film and a novel** of your choice. These two texts must be from the same genre, but cannot be from the same series of novels or films. You should use visual aids (PowerPoint, Prezi etc.) to assist you in your presentation.

Your speech will be 5-6 minutes in length and must address the following criteria.

- Introduce the names of your novel and film, name of author/director and outline its genre/genres.
- Identify the reasons you have chosen to study these two texts.
- Briefly outline this genre's main conventions, including themes, setting, characters, events and features of entertainment such as suspense.

- Briefly summarise each text's storyline, focusing on character, themes and important narrative events.
- Analyse how the film and novel adhere to and/or subvert genre conventions.
- Outline how the author uses film/language techniques to explore key themes and issues.

Task Two – Possible Grade B-E

For Task Two, you will present a speech in class focused on the representation of genre conventions in a **film** of your choice. You should use visual aids (PowerPoint, Prezi etc.) to assist you in your presentation.

Your speech will be 3-4 minutes in length and must address the following criteria.

- Introduce the name of your film, director and outline its genre.
- Identify the reasons you have chosen to study this text.
- Briefly outline this genre's main conventions, including themes, setting, characters, events and features of entertainment such as suspense.
- Briefly summarise the film's storyline, focusing on character, themes and important narrative events.
- Analyse how the film adheres to and/or subvert these genre conventions using specific textual references.
- Outline how the author uses film techniques to explore key themes and issues.

On the due date you must submit:

1. **Your palm cards.** All students will need to use palm cards to assist in the presentation of their task. However, students should avoid becoming over reliant on their palm cards.
2. **A transcript of your speech.** A transcript is a written copy of your speech.
3. **Printed and digital** copies of your PowerPoint presentation. Your digital copy should be saved on a USB with your full name as the file name. You are responsible for ensuring that you have a backup of any digital files, e.g. on Google Drive, Prezi, OneDrive.
4. A copy of the assessment **marking criteria**.

IMPORTANT:

- Marks will be deducted for not meeting time limits.
- Students must not do their speech on any film/novel text they have studied in class.
- This task is part of your formal assessment in English. Tasks not submitted on the due date will receive zero marks and may affect the successful completion of this course. If you are sick on the due date, you will have to provide a medical certificate to support your appeal. A medical certificate will need to be presented to Mr Zouroudis or your teacher on the morning of your first back at school.
